Even though their romance is over, he longs to find a way back to her.

Young Adult	14+ Romantasy, Semi-historical fiction	Dark and Deepest Red	Anna-Marie McLemore	Summer, 1518. A strange sickness sweeps through Strasbourg: women dance in the streets, some until they fall down dead. As rumors of witchcraft spread, suspicion turns toward Lavinia and her family, and Lavinia may have to do the unimaginable to save herself and everyone she loves. 500 years later Rosella and Emil navigate a similar phenomenon.

This is a story about accepting yourself and coming to terms with your identity. Target age 12+ with themes of fitting in, mental health, self-acceptance, coming out, and coming of age.
Middle Grade	Fiction, Family, Social Sit.	Small Town Pride	Stamper	Finalist for Best Middle Grade and Children's Book A School Library Journal. Jake is just starting to enjoy life as his school's first openly gay kid. While his family and friends are accepting and supportive, the same can't be said about everyone in their small town of Barton Springs, Ohio.
Middle Grade	Fiction, Family, Social Sit.	From Night Owl to Dogfish	Meg Wolitzer & Holly Goldberg Sloan	When their dads fall in love, Bett and Avery are sent, against their will, to the same sleepaway camp. Their dads hope that they will find common ground and become friends—and possibly, one day, even sisters. But things soon go off the rails for the girls (and for their dads too), and they find themselves on a summer adventure that neither of them could have predicted. A moving, exuberant, laugh-out-loud novel about friendship and family, told entirely in emails & letters.
